The Bitcoin-to-gold ratio has plummeted to levels historically associated with market bottoms, last seen in 2015, 2018, 2020, and 2022. Each time, Bitcoin followed with rallies between 100% and 600%.

Bitcoin and gold have surged this year. The precious metal's price has increased 38% year-to-date, hitting an all-time high of \$3,530 per ounce Wednesday, according to Trading Economics. Bitcoin's price has increased 20% to \$112,000 over the same period, according to crypto data provider CoinGecko.

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Although \$1 trillion is a large number, the Standard Chartered analysts pointed out that it represents "just 2% of aggregate deposits in our 'high-vulnerability' countries."

Bitcoin dropped below \$108,000 per coin in September as the biggest digital coin started "showing signs of exhaustion," according to Glassnode analysts, as long-term holders took profits and ETF flows slowed down.

In 2025, crypto remains a mix of opportunity and challenge. Prices continue to fluctuate as fresh regulations, new tech and AI trends influence how the market moves.
