The author encountered an issue with the PlayStation Network's (PSN) device setup password (DSP) system. After creating a DSP, they found that using it on the PS3 instead of their regular PSN password caused problems when trying to log in. Apparently, once you use a DSP, you must always use it when logging in, not your PSN password. The author assumed this meant they could go back to using their regular password after setting up the DSP, but it didn't work that way. It turned out that the system requires the DSP to be used on every device that logs in, including the PS3. The author had to re-enter the DSP on each device, which can be inconvenient. There's a glitch with the DSP website where the passwords don't update properly, causing issues with the PS3, Vita, and PSP devices. To resolve this, users must activate two-step verification and then delete previous passwords before creating new ones. Once you create a DSP, you have to remember it because if you forget it, you can only log in by revoking and creating a new one. Sony introduced a new security system that requires unique passwords for PS3, PS Vita, and PSP consoles. However, users can't directly use their PSN passwords on the consoles due to security concerns. Many find it frustrating that they have to write down or record their passwords, which is not a secure practice. Some have experienced issues with the DSP website, where updates often fail to recognize password changes, leading to an endless cycle of QR messages asking for password updates. To resolve this issue, users must activate 2-step verification and delete previous passwords before creating new ones. Fortunately, some reported that their generated passwords were accepted after a few minutes. Experts believe this new system was implemented as a temporary fix due to the insecure storage of passwords on consoles and servers. They note that Sony waited a decade after being hacked to introduce such measures. Proponents argue that this system improves security by making it difficult for hackers to access accounts using compromised PS3 devices, which can then be used to spam login requests. To use PlayStation Network on PS Vita, create a Device Setup Password via web browser: 1. Log in to Account Management online. 2. Choose 'Generate New Password.' 3. Note down or save the password for safekeeping. Use this password to sign in on your PS Vita. Some features are available only through PC or mobile browsers for performance improvements.
