Types of License Plates in Massachusetts Most vehicle owners who need to obtain new registration plates in Massachusetts opt for purchasing standard passenger plates, which display a white background with red lettering or a white background with green lettering. However, the RMV also offers other types of car tags, such as passenger reserved plates, veterans plates, special plates or organizational plates. Additional types of car registration plates include disability tags, vanity plates, lottery plates, electric vehicle plates and low-speed vehicle plates. Furthermore, RMV license plate fees and requirements typically vary according to each type of tag. For instance, organizational car registration tags help to support local causes, such as the Blackstone Valley, Fish and Wildlife and Cure Breast Cancer institutions. As such, these tags may incur higher costs in order to support local organizations. Note: The Massachusetts RMV does not provide vehicle owners with temporary registration plates, unless the driver loses or damages his or her current car tag. How to Apply for a License Plate in Massachusetts Car owners must apply for a Massachusetts RMV license plate after purchasing a new or used vehicle from a private seller or licensed dealership in the state. However, the license plate application process differs slightly depending on where motorists acquire the vehicle. For example, if drivers purchase a vehicle from a car dealership, the dealer must complete the titling and registration application on behalf of the buyer. Then, car owners must bring the new car tag application to their insurance agent, who will stamp the paperwork. After having your car registration tag application certified by an auto insurance agent, motorists must submit the form in person at an RMV branch, along with the vehicles certificate of origin, current title certificate (or the dealers re-assignment form) and the vehicles previous registration certificate. On the other hand, if you intend to get MA car tags after purchasing a vehicle from a private seller, you must visit an insurance agent to obtain an auto insurance policy. Then, the insurance agent must complete, sign and stamp your application form before you can submit it to an RMV branch along with all of the supporting documentation. How to Renew License Plate Tags in Massachusetts In most cases, vehicle owners must renew license plate credentials once every two years. However, certain types of vehicle require drivers to complete the annual car tag renewal process in Massachusetts, including vehicles with personalized plates, government vehicles, emergency vehicles and certain military or commercial vehicles. As a reminder of the vehicles upcoming expiration date, the RMV sends motorists a renewal notice between six and eight weeks before the vehicles license plate is set to expire. If you do not receive a license plate renewal notice for any reason, you must request an appropriate form from your insurance agent. Moreover, an insurance agent must complete and stamp this form before you submit it to the RMV. Renewing license plate materials can be done online, in person, over the phone or by mail. In order to renew a car registration tag online, applicants must follow the instructions on the official RMV portal, where they will provide their drivers license number and vehicles registration number. Then, motorists must submit payment in the form of a credit card, debit card or check. If car owners cannot complete the online car tag renewal process, they may apply over the telephone by using the RMVs automated phone system and providing their vehicles registration number along with their drivers license number. To renew RMV car tags in person or by mail, vehicle owners must submit their registration renewal notice (with a valid auto insurance stamp, if applicable), along with an acceptable payment method for the applicable plate renewal fees. How to Replace License Plates in Massachusetts In order to replace license plate credentials, you must visit an RMV branch in person or request a replacement over the phone. This procedure is most common when your MA RMV license plate goes missing or sustains enough damages. As a general rule, you must order a replacement credential through the Registry of Motor Vehicles. Moreover, if both of your license plates are lost or were stolen from you, you will be given a new car tag number while replacing license plate credentials. If you need to replace green Massachusetts car tags, you may exchange them for a set of red plates at no charge. During the process of how to replace license plate credentials such as these, you must complete the appropriate application form and submit it in person at an RMV branch. Additionally, you must surrender your current license plates, in the case that they are still in your possession. How to Transfer License Plates in Massachusetts After you purchase a new or used vehicle, you may transfer your current Massachusetts car registration tags to the newly-acquired vehicle if you wish to retain your license plates. However, you may only transfer car registration plates within seven calendar days from selling or disposing of your previous vehicle. In order to transfer your RMV car tags from one vehicle to another, you must complete the transfer while registering the new vehicle with the Registry of Motor Vehicles. During this time, you must pay tag transfer fees and submit all of the standard documentation for registering a vehicle in the state. Massachusetts License Plate Fees In most cases, vehicle owners must pay RMV car tag fees in Massachusetts every other year. However, certain types of vehicles may require an annual registration fee. Furthermore, new car tag fees generally vary for commercial vehicles, motorcycles, auto homes, buses and other vehicle types. In addition, car owners must be mindful of the additional fees related to services such as replacing car tags or transferring license plates from one vehicle to another. In the case of commercial vehicles, RMV license plate fees vary according to the weight of each vehicle. The standard registration fee, which includes the issuance of license plates, is \$60. If youve found yourself having to obtain new plates after one or both have become lost or damaged - you will need to request a replacement through the RMV. You are allowed to request one or two replacement plates at any time. These replacement plates will have the exact same number and be the same plate type as your current registration plates. Orders can be easily handled online on the RMVs website, or by setting up an in-person appointment with your local RMV. What do you need to order replacement plates? In order to replace your vehicles current license plates, you will be required to provide the following: The completed Application for Replacement Plates The vehicle's current license plate number Proof of vehicle ownership, such as the vehicle's registration or title Additional information about the driver and vehicle The replacement fee Additionally, in order to receive replacement plates in Massachusetts, your vehicle must be insured under an auto insurance policy that meets the state's minimum coverage standards. Proof of insurance may be required to complete the replacement process. How much does it cost to replace my license plate(s)? License plate replacement fees for all plate types will cost you \$10 per plate. However, there is no fee attached if your vehicle failed inspection for an illegible plate. How long does it take to get a replacement plate? The amount of time it will take to receive your replacement plate can vary. In most cases, they should be mailed to your address within 10 to 14 business days. Once completing your replacement application, the RMV will issue you a plate permit to keep in your vehicle until your new plate arrives. This plate permit may be used for inspection if needed. If youve lost your front license plate, you are required to make a temporary license plate number to attach to the front of your vehicle. If you have instead lost your rear license plate, you must attach your remaining front license plate to the rear of the vehicle as well as request a replacement expiration decal. You must then also create a temporary plate with the plate number to attach to the front of your vehicle. Another thing Massachusetts drivers should be aware of is that if you have older green license plates that are damaged, lost, or no longer legible, then they will need to be replaced with red plates instead. This replacement is free of charge, but you would be able to keep your older plates as long as they have been recently redone to be easier to read. How do I transfer plates in Massachusetts? Transferring license plates from one vehicle to another is a common transaction most drivers will encounter at some point. Whether you just got a new vehicle or are gifting one, the RMV easily allows drivers to transfer plates from old to new vehicles or to another driver. Drivers should not go through the process of transferring plates with the RMV until they have gone to their insurance agency or auto dealer to process the transaction. In Massachusetts, you typically are allowed a 7-calendar-day grace period from the day you dispose of your previous vehicle to register your new vehicle. However, during this time you must carry proof of ownership transfer in the event you are stopped by the police. What do I need to transfer my plates? To transfer your license plates/vehicle registration to another vehicle, you will be required to supply the following: How much does it cost to transfer plates? The price of transferring plates will vary depending on your specific plate type. For a full list of RMV plate types and associated fees, refer to the RMVs Schedule of Fees. How long does it take to transfer plates? After you complete the transfer transaction, you should receive a registration certificate with the new vehicle information. The title should then be processed and mailed to you within 6 to 8 weeks. If you currently have a loan on the vehicle, the title will be mailed directly to your lienholder. What if I have low number/lottery plates? If youve applied for the Massachusetts low plate lottery or have inherited a low number plate, the process of transitioning to your new plate will require some different steps due to their rarity. When looking to transfer from your current vehicle plate, you should bring the following to the RMV: Your old license plates A completed RTA (Registration and Title Application) form stamped by your insurance company (if the vehicle is currently registered) The vehicle's current registration Your drivers license If youve instead looking to register a new vehicle with the low number plates, you would need to bring the following to the RMV: A completed RTA (Registration and Title Application) form stamped by your insurance company Title (if the vehicle is used) Certificate of origin (if the vehicle is new) Bill of Sale (if the vehicle is new) Your drivers license If youve inherited low number plates from a loved one, you may be at a loss for how to handle the entire vehicle transfer process.
