Skip to main contentIn 1954, a year after the Oscars were first televised, the Academy introduced a fashion show as part of the Best Costume Design segment. But what started out as a tasteful tribute to dressmaking gradually morphed into a surreal pageant. Highlights over the years include an elephant clad in a Passage to India costume in 1958, Regency-era gentlemen in Vilmont garb breakdancing across the stage in 1960, and Tyra Banks strutting - in Victoria's Secret-style - in a demure Scene and Sensibility gown for what would be the final showcase in 1996. That last gasp came just 12 months after the costume designer Lizzy Gardiner arrived at the Oscars in a dress made of 254 Armani Gold cards - clearly, the red carpet now supplied enough in the way of fashion spectacle to render an in-show segment superfluous. Cynthia Erivo and Ariana Grande swept onto the red carpet in Elphaba-green Louis Vuitton and Glinda-prink Schiaparelli, followed by Michelle Yeoh and Rave in electric blue Balenciaga and hot red Vivienne Westwood. Miley Cyrus and Lily-Rose Depp took the opposite approach - sheer, pitch-black sheaths by McQueen and Chanel - breaking with the still-on-going trend for Old Hollywood, as seen on Elle Fanning in Givenchy, Mikey Madison in Prada and Selena Gomez in Ralph Lauren. Celeb after celeb, Hollywood's A-listers put on an award-worthy display of fashion that continuously kept audiences tuning back to the red carpet each year. The 2025 Oscars red carpet was no exception. Actresses like Ariana Grande and Cynthia Erivo dazzled in showstopping looks featuring jaw-dropping details like gravity-defying peplums and sculptural necklines. Demi Moore and Selena Gomez also stunned in shimmering beaded gowns that embodied the Oscars statue, while The View co-host Whoopi Goldberg dripped in liquid-like fabric. Others, such as Scarlett Johansson and Mikey Madison, pulled looks from the vault, managing to bring a modern twist to archival looks. Fanning was a vision in white tulle, while Erivo's gown featured a custom Boucheron necklace that resembled a pair of lips. Cynthia Erivo needed to embody Elphaba on the Oscars red carpet. The actress, nominated for her role in Wicked, wore a custom velvet sculptural gown by Louis Vuitton. The Emilia Pérez channel dressed stepped on the red carpet in a dress straight out of a Parisian dream. Custom-made for Saldña, she wore Saint Laurent by Anthony Vaccarello bubble gown with sheer opera gloves. If you can't decide between a dress or a tuxedo, why not both? The singer stepped onto the red carpet in a custom Balmain dress featuring a shimmering leopard print. She accessorized with a matching scarf that gave her a diva allure. Chanel ambassador Margaret Qualley leaned on the Parisian house for the Oscars. She wore a classic black gown, which took over 150 hours to make, inspired by a look from the Spring/Summer 2005 collection. Halle Berry channeled a mirrorball on the Oscars red carpet.
