Located within Lochaber Geopark in the Highlands, the deep valley and towering mountains of Glen Coe were formed over millennia of shifting glaciers and volcanic eruptions. Glencoe village is located between the banks of Loch Leven and the mouth of the famous glen. It's the perfect base for exploring the Lochaber area, known as the Outdoor Capital of the UK.Catch the CityLink bus from various points in Glasgow and in a little over two hours you will enter the Pass of Glencoe. There are several stops along the length of the route. A CityLink service runs from Uig in the north of Skye and travels south to Glasgow, the bus stops at various points along the way. A local bus service runs from Inverness to Fort William. Change buses to reach the Glencoe area. Catch the train from Glasgow Queen Street and enjoy the scenic ride up to Fort William. You can disembark at Crianlarich or Bridge of Orchy, both of which are within easy reach of Glencoe by car. From the north, a local train service runs from Mallaig to Fort William or, during the peak season, you can hop aboard The Jacobite steam train. The route to Glencoe is one of the most spectacular in Scotland. The main road north runs through the famous glen itself. If travelling south through Fort William, the drive will take you past Ben Nevis, the highest mountain in the UK.The drive from Glasgow to Glencoe takes just over two hours while Fort William is only half an hour away. Find out more about driving to GlencoeMany visitors arrive in Glencoe while walking the famous long-distance footpath - the West Highland Way, which will take you over Rannoch Moor, and drop you down directly into Kinlochleven then continue into Fort William.Exploring on two wheels is easy with plenty of on and off-road cycle routes around the area. The landscape offers challenging terrain and cycle paths for every level and type of bike. Various types of bike suitable for exploring the roads or local trails are available for hire from a number of bike hire businesses in the area. There is a regular bus service (no 44) operated by Shiel Buses which runs between Kinlochleven and Fort William, stopping in Glencoe, Ballachulish and villages and hamlets. The bus also goes to Duror and Kentallen.West Coast Motors also runs a service which runs between Oban and Fort William and stops at many places around Glencoe. Parking is widely available throughout the area and there are two filling stations available, one in North Ballachulish and another in Glencoe village. Starring Daniel Craig as 007, Skyfall sees the secret agent returning to his Scottish roots, with the main part of the action taking place at Bond's family home, Skyfall Lodge, which is located in awe-inspiring Glen Coe. Keep reading to explore more Skyfall filming locations in Scotland.It's no accident that Bond's family estate is located in Glen Coe. Ian Fleming, James Bond's creator, was reportedly so impressed by Sean Connery's portrayal of his most famous character in Dr No (1962) that he gave Bond some Scottish heritage.In the novel You Only Live Twice Fleming reveals that, as a boy, 007 attended Fettes College - a private school in Edinburgh - whilst the iconic setting for Bond's family estate in Skyfall comes directly from On Her Majesty's Secret Service (1969) - the film in which Bond reveals that his father is originally from Glencoe.Ian Fleming's family owned a lodge in Glen Etive, which is located next to Glen Coe.Follow in the footsteps of Britain's most suave secret agent with a visit to some of the iconic Scottish film locations. Absorb the raw splendour of Glen Coe's rugged peaks as you follow the same road 007 travelled along in Skyfall or visit Eilean Donan Castle, the Scottish headquarters of M16 in The World is Not Enough (1999).Scenes from Skyfall were shot in Glen Coe as well as in nearby Glen Etive. In a driving sequence filmed in the Highlands on the A82 near the striking peaks of Buachaille Etive Mor (pictured) and Buachaille Etive Beag, the secret agent's iconic Aston Martin DB5 manages to get unstaged by the stunning atmospheric scenery. The mountains were formed through violent volcanic eruptions, and then sculpted by massive glaciers. Fingal, the legendary Celtic hero, is said to have made his home among these towering mountains, while his poet son, Ossian, found inspiration in the landscape. On 13 February 1692, 38 men, women and children of the MacDonald clan were murdered by a regiment of soldiers (acting on behalf of the government) whom they had welcomed into their homes. The tragedy of the Glencoe Massacre still has the power to evoke powerful emotions. Glencoe is also the home of Scottish mountaineering, and climbers will find plenty of challenges in the crests and ridges of Anach Eagach, the Three Sisters or any of the eight Munros on the estate. There are also good hillwalking routes and easier rambles, such as the walk to Signal Rock.
