In this article, we will show you how to save multiple Excel sheets as one PDF. Simply follow the steps below. Follow the steps below on how to convert multiple Excel sheets into one PDF. To select multiple sheets, hold down the Ctrl key on your keyboard and click on each sheet tab you want to include at the bottom of the Excel window. The selected sheets will be highlighted. Click on the "File" menu located at the top left corner of the screen. From the dropdown menu, select "Print." This will open the print settings window where you can configure your printing options. In the print settings window, find the printer selection dropdown. After that, choose "Microsoft Print to PDF" or another PDF printer option. This setting saves your document as a PDF file instead of sending it to a physical printer. In the print settings, find the section labeled "Settings." Then, ensure that the "Print Entire Workbook" option is selected. This option will include all the sheets you highlighted in the final PDF. Additionally, you can adjust page orientation, paper size, and other settings as needed. Once your settings are configured, click the "Print" button. A dialog box will appear prompting you to choose a location to save the PDF file. Finally, select your desired location, enter a file name, and click "Save" to create the PDF. The PDF was developed by Adobe back in the early 90s and it has become increasingly popular since the advent of the Internet and Social Media. PDF files typically contain both text and images and it is these images that can often increase the file size, in some cases dramatically so. Many users, especially those at work, require files that are not prohibitive in size so that when they share or receive these files their mailboxes don't get blown. They also want to ensure they don't use up all their allocated storage on their device. That is why compressing files, specifically bigger files like PDF are so popular. You can use the Zamzar PDF compression tool to reduce the size of your PDF file without impacting the quality of your file thereby still allowing you to share or print these files. Method 1 - Save Multiple Excel Sheets as One PDF Using the 'Save As' Option There are three worksheets in our Excel workbook. Steps: Select Save As and click on the Browse option. When the Save As dialog box appears, specify a folder where the new file will be saved. Choose PDF from the Save as type dropdown list. Click on Options. When the Options dialog box appears, check Entire Workbook. Click on OK. Click on Save. You will be able to save the whole workbook as one PDF.
